
Extended Campus Scavenger Hunt

25. In the engineering quad, surrounded by buildings like Paige and Knowles, is this sculpture in front of ______ Hall.




26. Someone put a Shy Guy on the top edge of _____ Hall. Unfortunately, that little guy will never see the LGRC Tower right behind him...
